How to choose a host faculty?

When it comes to choosing your host faculty, it's important to take a number of factors into account in order to find the educational environment that best suits your goals and needs.

To do this, identify:

- The disciplines on offer
- The level of education and language required
- · Administrative and educational contacts

How does the application process work?

Students must:

- Apply for and be accepted into the exchange program at their home university
- · Being nominated at the UGA
- Apply online using the form sent by the host faculty at UGA

Choosing courses

Students should ensure that the courses they choose are in line with their course of study. They must comply with the rules of the host faculty at UGA: level of studies and language, minimum number of courses required, with up to a maximum of 30 credits per semester.

To fulfill the learning agreement, students must consult the instructions and select courses from the catalogue.
