6. Job description Earth system science indicates that unless the current economic system undergoes

fundamental transformation, the stability and resilience of the Earth system, which is the common foundation for human prosperity, will be lost. In our projects, we will engage in designing pathways for transitioning the current economic system and developing strategies for system transformation, as well as international rule-making, particularly for establishing international rules for valuing natural capital in collaboration with influential stakeholders.

Specifically, the successful applicant will engage in one or more of the following tasks.

- (1) Policy Analysis and Institutional Design: To conduct policy analysis, comparative assessment of policy options, and institutional design with effective economic incentives and internationally coordinated governance scheme. The options include tax, credits, border adjustment mechanisms, and regulations. Analysis and evaluation need not only environmental perspectives but also the contexts of industrial policy, trade policy, security, and diplomacy policy. Additionally, to examine the processes and roadmaps for implementing these policies and rules.
- (2) Policy Proposals: Based on (1) and systematically review of academic research, to draft and disseminate policy proposals. Also, to engage in circulation activities for these proposals within the international community.
- (3) Coalition Building and Engagement: To execute activities for ensuring the effectiveness of policy proposals. Specifically, after analyzing the structures of multi-stakeholder coalitions and communities, to identify key partners for collaboration and rule-making. Trust and relationships will be built with these identified stakeholders, and active collaborations and contributions will be made with them.
- (4) Building Platforms for International Rule-Making: To design and manage projects that serve as foundations for implementing international rule-making on critical global issues. These issues include resilient ecosystems, secure and trustworthy AI systems, and global health and One Health. To promote and conduct activities that broadly contribute to international rule-making, such as developing methodologies to cultivate capabilities of universities, companies, and other institutions for participating in international rule-making.
