Tour 1: Japanese Candy Art Experience (Amezaiku)

- ① Let's Try Making Traditional Japanese Candy Art!
- ② We will create our own "amezaiku," a traditional Japanese candy craft developed during the Edo period. After the workshop, we plan to have lunch together around Asakusa or near Arakawa.
- ③ Experience fee: ¥3,100
Transportation: Approx. ¥1,000

Tour 3: Torigoe Festival Visit

- ① Evening Visit to the Torigoe Festival
- ② After the Kabuki performance, we will visit the Torigoe Festival, one of Tokyo's well-known traditional local festivals held near Asakusa. The highlight is the "Sengan Mikoshi," a large portable shrine known as one of the heaviest in Tokyo. The lantern-lit streets and lively atmosphere create a unique festival experience. Participants can also enjoy local food stalls and explore the downtown area together.
- ③ Festival admission: Free
Transportation: Approximately ¥210 (one way)
Food and drinks: Not included
- ④ Meet near the entrance of Sunpearl Arakawa at 5:00 PM after the Kabuki performance. We will travel together to Torigoe Shrine.
- ⑤ The area may be crowded, so comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Please bring some cash, as some stalls may not accept credit cards.
